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Building Creativity And Imagination In Early Childhood Through Picture Story Books

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Abstrak

Anak-anak adalah pembelajar jujur yang mengekspresikan perasaan dan imajinasinya. Terkait dengan imajinasi, pada dasarnya semua anak adalah kreatif dimana menurut George & Zhou (dalam Ashkanasy & Rowe, 2008) kreativitas merupakan produk ide atau solusi yang baru dan bermanfaat. Membangun kreativitas dan imajinasi pada anak usia dini merupakan komponen penting dalam perkembangan kognitif, emosional dan sosial mereka. Buku cerita bergambar merupakan salah satu alat pendidikan yang paling efektif dalam menstimulasi kedua aspek tersebut. Penelitian ini bertujuan untuk mengkaji bagaimana penggunaan buku cerita bergambar dapat mengembangkan kreativitas dan imajinasi pada anak usia dini, serta metode penyajian yang terbaik. Melalui tinjauan literatur dan observasi partisipatif, penelitian ini menyoroti pentingnya peran ilustrasi dalam buku cerita bergambar. Building creativity and imagination in early childhood is a crucial component in their cognitive, emotional and social development. Picture storybooks are one of the most effective educational tools in stimulating these two aspects. This study aims to examine how the use of picture storybooks can develop creativity and imagination in early childhood, as well as the best method of presenting them. Through literature review and participatory observation, this research highlights the important role of illustrations in picture storybooks. Attractive and colourful images not only capture children's attention, but also help them understand and internalize the story better. These images provide a visual jolt that can enrich children's imagination, encouraging them to imagine worlds and characters that are not limited to their real-life experiences. This process helps children develop creative thinking skills, where they learn to think outside the real boundaries and find innovative solutions to various situations. This research also emphasizes the importance of choosing the right picture storybooks. The books selected should be appropriate for the child's age, interests and developmental level. Books with stories that promote positive values, such as cooperation, honesty and courage, can have a positive impact on children's ethical and social development.

Early childhood is a time when a child experiences certain physical, cognitive, socio-emotional, creative, linguistic, and communicative developments depending on the stages the child goes through. Early childhood education is a form of education that focuses on the growth and development of children, from their physical, intelligence or way of thinking, attitude, language and communication. Therefore, young children need adult support in order to develop their potential to the fullest. So that the child can grow into a good person over time. Although there are general patterns of child development that are sequential and predictable, children's development and learning patterns still differ from one another. Learning is the process by which children participate in academic activities to acquire knowledge. Because learning determines the realization of children's attitudes and behaviors, children's participation in learning creates perseverance, attention, motivation, independence and enthusiasm for learning. To determine the realization of good learning, requires strategies in child development. Therefore, educators must prepare strategies that children like and are interesting to explore children's interest in learning..

Early childhood is a critical period in human development where cognitive, social and emotional foundations begin to form. During this time, efforts to enrich children's learning experiences are a major focus for educators, parents and researchers. In this context, picture storybooks have been recognized as an effective tool in building creativity and imagination in young children. Creativity and imagination are important aspects of early childhood development that support their overall learning process. Creativity involves the ability to generate new ideas, find innovative solutions, and see the world from a unique perspective. Meanwhile, imagination allows children to visualize abstract concepts, tell stories, and explore the world beyond the boundaries of the real world..

A review of the literature shows that picture storybooks have been one of the effective tools in building creativity and imagination in young children. Previous studies highlight the various ways in which picture storybooks can stimulate children's imaginations through engaging narratives and inspiring images. With an in-depth literature review, this study aims to fill this knowledge gap by exploring the impact of using picture storybooks in building creativity and imagination in young children. Through a comprehensive literature review, this study will investigate recent findings in the relevant literature, identify trends, gaps, and recommendations for future research.

METHODS

This research uses a qualitative method with a case study approach to deeply understand the role of picture storybooks in building creativity and imagination in early childhood. The research was conducted in several kindergartens in major cities in Indonesia, with the research subjects consisting of children aged 4-6 years, teachers, and parents. Data collection techniques were collected through several techniques, namely:

A. Participatory Observation

Observations were conducted during picture storybook reading sessions in the classroom. The researcher observed the interaction between the children, their

response to the story, as well as the activities done after the reading session, such as drawing or retelling.

B. In-depth Interview

Interviews were conducted with teachers and parents to get their views on the influence of picture storybooks on children's creativity and imagination. The interviews also explored the types of books most commonly used and children's responses to the books.

C. Documentation

The researcher collected documentation in the form of photographs of reading activities, children's work, and teachers' notes on children's development after interaction with picture storybooks.

E. Data Analysis

Data from participatory observation and interviews will be analyzed using thematic analysis techniques. This process involves coding the data, identifying themes, and drawing conclusions based on patterns found in the data.

F. Validity and Reliability

Data validity will be maintained through method triangulation, which is by combining data from observations, interviews, and questionnaires. Reliability will be enhanced by testing the research instruments and verifying the data with respondents.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

This research examines how picture storybooks can build creativity and imagination in early childhood through participatory observation, in-depth interviews, and documentation in several kindergartens in big cities in Indonesia. The results show that children are very interested in picture storybooks with attractive and colorful illustrations. During the reading session, they seemed enthusiastic and focused on the story. Follow-up activities such as drawing and retelling after reading picture storybooks showed a significant increase in the use of imagination and creativity. The children were able to create their own version of the story, draw the characters and scenes they envisioned, and retell it with the

addition of new elements that were not in the original story. Social interaction between the children also increased during and after the reading sessions, with them often discussing, asking questions and arguing about their favorite stories or characters..

Teachers and parents interviewed reported that picture storybooks have a positive impact on children's language development and communication skills. Children used new vocabulary from the stories more frequently and were more confident in speaking in front of the group. In addition, they noted an improvement in children's ability to think critically and solve problems, especially in stories that involved puzzles or challenges that encouraged them to find creative solutions. The types of books that are most effective in stimulating creativity and imagination are those with engaging narratives, rich characters and detailed illustrations, and those that include interactive elements such as pop-ups or text that invites children to think or participate..

The visual documentation shows children's work that is rich in detail and imagination, reflecting a deep understanding of the story as well as additional elements that show their personal interpretations. The master's notes also show significant development in various cognitive and socio-emotional aspects of the children following the regular reading of picture storybooks. The discussion of the results of this study highlights several important aspects of building creativity and imagination in early childhood through picture storybooks:

1. The Role of Illustrations in Building Imagination

Illustrations in picture storybooks provide strong visual stimulation that helps children to better internalize and visualize the story. Images rich in color and detail allow children to explore imaginative worlds beyond their real-life experiences, thus expanding thinking horizons and enhancing creativity. 2. The Effect of Narrative on Creativity

Stories that present conflicts or puzzles encourage children to find creative solutions and develop out-of-the-box thinking skills. Narratives that contain an element of surprise or an unexpected ending can also stimulate children's curiosity and imagination, encouraging them to think more deeply and creatively. .

3. Social and Cognitive Interaction

Shared reading activities develop not only literacy skills but also social and emotional skills. Discussions and interactions between children as well as with the master or parents during reading sessions enrich the learning experience and facilitate the development of communication and cooperation skills. Children learn to listen to and respect the opinions of others, ask questions and share their own ideas. These interactions can also boost children's self-confidence and help them develop important social skills. .

4. Choosing the Right Book

Choosing the right picture storybooks is very important to maximize the benefits in developing children's creativity and imagination. Books that are appropriate for children's age, interests and developmental level will be more effective in motivating and engaging them in reading activities.
